Congratulations go to our Korean Chapter, KFPUG, for coordinating a Korean translation of CPM 4.1.1. In accordance with IFPUG rules, KFPUG assembled two highly qualified, independent teams to translate the CPM and review the resulting translation. Each team involved Certified Function Point Specialists (CFPS), highly trained software engineering professors and representatives from the Korean software industry. This important translation expands the availability of IFPUG Function Points in Asia. The CPM is now available in English, Italian, Spanish, Japanese, French and Korean. Many Certified Function Point Specialists are taking advantage of the Certification Extension Program and collecting credits to extend their certification.
